a message from our executive director

The Spring of 2022 brought change for Habitat for Humanity Quad Cities. Kristi Crafton, our steady, level-headed leader, announced her retirement and the search for a new Executive Director began. Kristi announced in July that I would be her replacement. With much excitement I joined the organization in mid-September and spent three months learning and training with Kristi. I want to assure you that my passion, motivation, and excitement for my new role and the mission of Habitat is unwavering. My commitment to our employees, our partner families, and our thousands of volunteers is also unwavering.

The Habitat campus experienced a small fire in June. Thankfully no one was hurt, but there was some damage to the roof of the building followed by some water damage and a heavy smoke smell throughout the building. Heavy duty exhaust fans were brought in for weeks to expel the smoke and every surface of the office had to be professionally cleaned. Everything has been repaired and we are grateful the fire damage was not any worse.

Every year, Habitat partners with thousands of individuals, businesses, other non-profits, and city municipalities in Scott and Rock Island County to bring light to our mission. In 2022, with the help of our community partners and thousands of volunteers, we were able to complete 36 home repairs, including 19 accessibility ramps, we completed five new home builds, and started construction on five more. In late November, Habitat purchased four single family homes from the City of Davenport for one dollar. We are currently renovating these homes and will place Habitat partner families in those homes as well.

During 2022 we had two Habitat partner families pay off their mortgages. The Habitat program helps to break generational poverty and is a hand up to low-income families. A paid-off asset like a home contributes to generational wealth and is certainly a cause for celebration for these partner families and for Habitat.

As we continue to emerge from the COVID-19 pandemic we are always in need of more volunteers, not only for home building but also for committees and lunch providers. Building material costs continue to fluctuate, but we have managed to start and renovate more homes than ever before and expect that trend to continue into 2023.

Habitat has been blessed with a wonderful, giving, and consistent donor base of both individuals and businesses. We, of course, cannot achieve our mission without your monetary support in addition to the thousands of volunteer hours and other donations in kind. I am excited for the coming year. The mission and call of Habitat are so important for our community, partner families, repair, and ramp families. I cannot thank each of you enough for all that you do for Habitat, for believing and investing in our mission and partner families, and for your continuing support. I look forward to meeting all of you in person throughout the year, and beyond!

one person can change the world

Nancy and Craig Foster are no strangers to Habitat for Humanity Quad Cities. In fact, Nancy helped start the Habitat ReStore with Cindy Kuhn in 2003. Over the years, she has met many partner families and witnessed firsthand how the Habitat program helps lift families out of the cycle of poverty and opens the door to a brighter future for that family. In 2021, Nancy and her husband Craig made the decision to change one family's world with the gift of homeownership. In doing so, they became the first couple to sponsor a whole Habitat house in the Quad Cities. Habitat House #121 was dedicated in 2022, and is now the home of Yasmine and her daughter Semaj.

"Originally, we wanted to be anonymous," Nancy says. The Fosters did not want the credit, and acknowledge that much more goes into a Habitat house besides money, including many other gifts of time and materials. After some discussion, they decided to forego the "anonymous donor" title and use their names, in the hope to be an inspiration to others. "We are blessed at our age to have enough to live on and still afford to sponsor a house." Nancy says that she and Craig hope others in a similar situation will also consider the opportunity.

Pat Grimm was close to follow when she learned of the opportunity to help. Pat is good friends with Nancy and Craig, and has volunteered with ReStore since the beginning. In 2022, Pat became the first single sponsor of a Habitat Quad Cities home.

Pat says "growing up I didn't have much, but I had more than some kids. One day when we were complaining, my dad said 'you have clothes on your back, food on the table, and a roof over your head, what more could you want?' and that really resonated with me". Pat believes that is part of the reason she has always loved Habitat; she wanted to be able to help put a roof over a family who needed it. Pat was able to sponsor a Habitat home through tax-deductible IRA distributions. "It's a win-win for all of us. It feels good to help." Home #126 will be completed in the summer of 2023. Pat looks forward to dedicating this house and handing over the keys to Armando and his two children Arcelia and Diego.

what we do

 **Home Building** - We build or renovate 4-5 homes each year. These homes are purchased by families with a low down payment, a no-interest mortgage and with affordable monthly mortgage payments that are based on the family's income. Families are selected based on need, ability to pay a mortgage and willingness to partner with Habitat. Families are paired with a mentor and are expected to accrue "sweat equity" through working alongside staff and volunteers. Families are also required to attend educational classes about budgeting, home maintenance, emergency preparedness, predatory lending, conflict resolution, and more. Applications are taken at select times throughout the year.

 **Neighborhood Revitalization** - We started this initiative in 2015, committing to a multi-year presence with a goal to strengthen one specific neighborhood. We spent seven years improving the Floreciente neighborhood in Moline, IL, through home repairs and beautification projects in partnership with local residents and stakeholders. We completed this project in 2022, and will begin a new venture in 2023.

 **Home Repair Program & Wheel Chair Ramps** - In February 2019, we began a home repair program. In this program, home repairs and construction of wheelchair ramps provide the opportunity for families to regain self-reliance. This program aligns with our mission to restore hope and empower our low-income, aging, or disabled neighbors. Applications are taken at select times throughout the year.

 **ReStore** - Started in 2002, this program accepts donations of new and gently used building materials, home furnishings, and appliances. In 2012 we began accepting donations of medical equipment and opened ReStore Health and Home. All items are sold at a discounted price and the profits are used to support our local Habitat programs. Our ReStore has helped divert over 15 million pounds of waste from landfills and helps make home repairs and medical equipment more affordable for shoppers.

 **Volunteer** - Volunteers keep our programs running and we have a variety of volunteer opportunities available. Opportunities include construction, ReStore, special events and "behind the hammer" activities such as committee membership, administrative help and lunch preparation for our volunteers. We also provide private sponsored build days as an opportunity for team-building for local corporations and organizations.

neighborhood revitalization

building thriving neighborhoods

Our Floreciente Neighborhood Revitalization program was truly transformational. For seven years, we worked collaboratively with residents, neighborhood stakeholders, and community partners to implement programs and develop solutions that align with the interests of neighborhood residents. The goal of this program was to support neighborhood-led change that empowers people to take ownership and pride in their neighborhood.

From affordable repairs, to beautification, to educational programs, we addressed targeted needs that had both an immediate and long term impact on the neighborhood. 2022 was a turning point for this program and the Floreciente Neighborhood is prepared to continue to thrive independently. We couldn't be more proud of this neighborhood and the partnerships that have formed over the years.



As we wrap up the final repair projects in Floreciente, we are preparing to move forward into a new and exciting neighborhood venture in 2023.

home repair & ramp program

safe at home

Habitat for Humanity Quad Cities' staff and volunteers are dedicated to restoring hope for our neighbors. One of the ways we do this is by filling service gaps in our community. Besides home building, for the past three years we have assisted low-income families with home repairs and accessibility ramps all across the Quad Cities. This program focuses on critical home repairs and modifications that make homes safer and healthier places to live.

The home repair program typically completes 30-40 projects each year, including the construction of accessibility ramps. In 2022, we were right on target with 36 home repairs and modifications completed, including 19 ramps.

These projects assisted a total of 66 low-income residents within the Quad Cities. Of those residents, 27 were age 65 or older. Most of the work on home repairs and accessibility ramps is done by volunteers. With the exception of occasional groups, we have just a small pool of regular volunteers assisting with these projects, and we truly couldn't do it without them!

Thanks to the support of our amazing community, ReStore had record sales for eight months of 2022! Our sales are stronger than ever thanks to donations of overstock, discontinued product, renovation leftovers, and gently used items from locally owned businesses and corporate stores. Many individuals scheduled free pickups or dropped off donations which keep our inventory up. Through a grant and several generous donors, we were able to purchase a used delivery truck (shown below), which has increased productivity and the flow of donations to our ReStore.

While we had a great year, we continue to look for donations from businesses and individuals that might not realize their unused items can make a big impact in the community. 


